Dear Mr. President:

On behalf of the Fair Labor Association (FLA), we commend your administration's efforts to advance economic and social development in Peru. The FLA looks to governments like yours to support and enforce the rule of law in order to ensure that business and workers can operate in a fair and safe environment.

The FLA is a collaborative effort of socially responsible companies, colleges and universities, and civil society organizations working to promote and protect workers' rights and to improve working conditions globally through adherence to international standards.

FLA-affiliated companies that source from Peruvian factories have voiced concerns over current legislation that permits the employment of workers through the use of repeated short-term employment contracts. The FLA echoes their concerns as this practice does not provide stability to workers in employment and erodes workers' access to fundamental labor rights.

We believe your leadership is necessary for Peru to demonstrate its strong support for decent work and to bring legislation into conformity with international labor standards and the principle of freedom of association.

Again, we congratulate you on the advances Peru has been making under your leadership and we look forward to continued progress.
