FIRE SAFETY COMPETENCY ASSESSMENT



Preventing fires and saving lives by empowering workers and managers

This fire prevention / fire protection competency self-assessment is a management tool for implementing practical actions to improve fire safety at the workplace. It is based on the Fair Labor Association's Foundational Fire Safety Competency List. This self-assessment is applicable for all workplaces regardless of their level of economic development.

Managers, supervisors, workers' representatives, members of the health and safety committee, the occupational safety and health officer, the fire safety officer, and workplace fire safety facilitators should be involved in the completion of this assessment and identification of priorities for action. For certain elements, it is also advisable to involve local emergency authorities such as the local fire brigade.

The assessment team, in concert with the occupational safety and health committee, may also wish to consider additional items to improve fire protection at the workplace.

This competency self-assessment should be translated into local language(s).

How to use this tool:

Assign a team of people to carry out the assessment exercise based on the above list. The team then should go through the following steps:

- 1. Review the items with the team. Clarify any items necessary.
- 2. Plan to review the entire enterprise either using the whole team at once (in a small or medium-sized enterprise) or dividing areas to be checked among the team.
- 3. Walk through the plant and complete the assessment.
 - · Look carefully at each item.
 - · Look for a way to apply the item.
 - If needed for clarity, ask the supervisor or workers in the area questions relevant to the items.
 - Initially check No (no action needed) or Yes (action needed).
 - Add comments, suggestions or reminders under remarks.
- 4. After completing the initial assessment, individually review items marked **Yes**. Mark the ones that are critical or important as **Priority**.
- 5. Ensure that all items are marked No or Yes.
 - · Some items marked Yes will be Priority.
 - Any item that is not applicable should be marked No as no action is needed.
- 6. Immediately after completion of the assessment, prepare suggestions to present to management. These suggestions should address what action should be taken, by whom and when.
- 7. If necessary, the assessment team should seek clarification from fire protection specialists at the local fire brigade, the labour inspectorate, occupational safety and health institutes, national safety organizations or national fire protection associations. The sourcing brand may also have individuals with specialized knowledge in applying some of these competency items.
